

WEEKLY NOTES


- Corn and soybeans really making headway in my territory.

- Most silage cutting is wrapping up this week.








WEEKLY NOTES


- Harvest is starting for a few in my area and will be in full-force shortly.

WEEKLY NOTES


- Wheat is mostly wrapped up, with surprisingly great yields. Buns is coming in as the yield leader in most areas!





2023 North East North Dakota Departure From Normal






WEEKLY NOTES





2023 South East North Dakota Departure From Normal





WEEKLY NOTES

- Things are progressing fast!
- Corn chopping is either completed or in progress. A lot of corn has hit black layer with many plants are brown from the tassel to the ground. There's been some talk of corn harvest possibly happening in a week or two.
- Soybeans are turning fast as well. Most fields are holding on to a few yellow leaves, with a few greener spots scattered throughout.
- Not seeing any frost in the weather yet!



PROSPER


- Harvest is coming fast!

KINDRED

- All of the wheat in our area is off and tillage has begun.
- Soybeans and corn are progressing well. Beans are filling pods to the top very well.
- Corn is around 50-75% milk line stage.

HUNTER

- Row crop harvest is upon us with many fields of edibles coming off and a few soybean fields have been harvested. Early yields are on the average side, which was expected where the soybeans finished a little early.
- Corn is coming along fast now as well, with some hand shelled samples measuring moisture in the low 20s. Yields look to be holding on with nice looking kernel counts. Now we wait to see how kernel size/weight turns out.
- Anthracnose is becoming a concern on certain fields where stalks are more than likely going to be an issue. I would look into prioritizing harvest order by fields that have been hit worse than others. In some cases, waiting until beans are finished may be too late.
